

Risk Assessment Personal Protective Equipment

Prior to works commencing

- 1. Where there is a risk to Health and Safety, which cannot be effectively controlled by any other means, suitable Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) must be used.
- 2. Some risks will always be present requiring the use of PPE to control them.
- 3. Safety helmets must be worn at all times in 'Hard Hat Areas' or where there is a risk of head injury.
- 4. Safety shoes or boots suitable protective footwear must be worn at all times by all Staff
- 5. Suitable protective clothing is required when working outdoors in adverse weather conditions. As a minimum all staff shall wear protective jacket and trousers as depending on what is appropriate for the tasks being carried out
- 6. High visibility jacket or vest should be worn when required.
- 7. Protective gloves of the correct type are required if handling sharp, tough or coarse materials. Other hazards requiring gloves are thermal, chemical and vibration situations.
- 8. Eye or face protection is required where there is a foreseeable risk of injury i.e. pruning, using power tools generally. Persons nearby may also need protection. Goggles must be worn when using any type of gardening machinery.
- 9. Hearing protection must be used where noise levels cause discomfort or where signs indicate they should be worn. Persons nearby may also need protection.
- 10. Respiratory Protective Equipment (RPE) must be used where harmful fumes, dust or vapours could be inhaled.
- 11. Barrier cream may be required for some tasks and in some circumstances.
- 12. Provide fire extinguishers where appropriate.

Hazards

1. As indicated above.

Harm

- 1. Minor cuts, amputation, stab wounds, fatality from blood loss, falls or electrocution.
- 2. Respiratory problems, musculoskeletal injuries, dermatitis, eye injuries.

Persons at Risk

- 1. Staff.
- 2. Others in vicinity e.g. passers-by.

Control Measures

1. Utilisation of PPE.
